<p>While setting up one of my new laptops I loaded Windows 7 and Arch Linux on the same drive; using a USB drive to boot into the LUKS encrypted Arch partition and having the Windows OS boot normally. I intend to have the Windows 7 partition be intentionally insecure (as if it weren't already), so I will have a standard user automatically log in. To do this I did the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Click <u>Start</u>, type netplwiz, and then press <u>Enter</u>.• In the <u>User Accounts</u> dialog box, click the User Account you want to automatically log on to.• <u>Uncheck</u> the Users Must Enter A User Name And Password To Use This Computer box.• Click <u>OK</u>.• In the <u>Automatically Log On</u> dialog box, enter the user's password twice and click <u>OK</u>.
