## **Description**

While setting up one of my new laptops I loaded Windows 7 and Arch Linux on the same drive; using a USB drive to boot into the LUKS encrypted Arch partition and having the Windows OS boot normally. I intend to have the Windows 7 partition be intentionally insecure (as if it weren't already), so I will have a standard user automatically log in. To do this I did the following:

- Click Start, type netplwiz, and then press Enter.
- In the <u>User Accounts</u> dialog box, click the **User Account** you want to automatically log on to.
- <u>Uncheck</u> the **Users Must Enter A User Name And Password To Use This Computer** box.
- Click OK.
- In the Automatically Log On dialog box, enter the user's password twice and click OK.
