<p>This is a simple guide for automatically logging as a user with an XFCE session on Debian.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Edit the lightdm config file: <pre>sudo nano /etc/lightdm/lightdm.conf</pre><ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ Uncomment these two lines and replace bob with your username: <pre>autologin-user=bob autologin-user-timeout=0</pre></li></ul></li><li>• Reconfigure the lightdm package so that changes are taken into effect: <pre>sudo dpkg-reconfigure lightdm</pre></li></ul>
