| <p>While doing some common administration with the sed command line tool on FreeBSD, I found that the normal sed command would not work:</p> <pre>sed -i 's/changing/changed/g' /path/to/files/*</pre> <ul style="list-style-type: none">I found a workaround on the FreeBSD forums that suggested the syntax should look more like the following:<pre>find . -type f -exec sed -i "" 's/changing/changed/g' {} \;</pre>To use sed on a single file:<pre>sed -i '' -e 's/replace/textreplace/g' /path/to/file.txt</pre> | | | |
