<p>Peerguardian is an excellent program to protect from known bad IP addresses. It can be installed on Arch Linux from the AUR, and requires a little workaround (currently) to get it to start with systemd.</p>			
Install PeerGuardian

<pre>sudo pacman -U gksu</pre>			
<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. NOTE: You may need to configure gksu with gksu-properties.			
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Install PeerGuardian:			
<pre>wget https://aur.archlinux.org/packages/pg/pgl/pgl.tar.gz tar xzf pgl.tar.gz cd pgl makepkg -s PKGBUILD</pre>			
<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Install the package:			
<pre>sudo pacman -U pgl*.xz</pre>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Open pglgui and configure IP blacklists• When PeerGuardian lists are updated and ready to run, open a terminal and run:			
<pre>sudo systemctl start pgl.service</pre>
